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Advanced Placement for the LPN (Transition Student)

Admission for Spring 2024 (Day and Evening Option)

A Nursing Transition plan has been designed for the Licensed Practical Nurse who desires to enter the Associate Degree Nursing program with advanced standing. Applicants who meet the admission requirements outlined below and successfully complete the Nursing Transition course (NUR 214) with a "B" or better, will be allowed to enroll in NUR 113 and complete the Associate Degree program requirements. Applicants who are taking NUR 214 have been accepted into the Associate Degree Nursing program. Each step of the admission procedure must be completed before moving to the next step.

Admission Procedure

The nursing applicant will be required to meet steps I-IV before admission. Each step of the admission procedure must be completed before moving to the next step.

STEP I Application Process: Deadline: October 15

- A. Applicants must submit an admissions application to Wilson Community College with an official high school transcript or equivalency and all post-secondary coursework.
- B. Applicants must submit all required documents and complete the admissions process, to be officially admitted to the college.
- C. Applicants must complete an Allied Health Intent Form available under Allied Health at www.wilsoncc.edu. Applicants should indicate whether they are applying to the evening or day transition option for Spring 2024 semester.

STEP II Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS): Deadline October 15

- A. Applicants who have completed Step I will schedule an appointment to take the TEAS by signing up online through the placement testing Google form which can be found under the admissions placement testing tab. Applicants are allowed to take the TEAS twice in a 12 month period at least 30 days apart. The highest TEAS score taken within the last two years will be used for ranking.
 - 1. Applicants will be required to pay a \$65.00 testing fee to the Business Office (F-101)
 - 2. Picture ID and payment receipt must be presented at the time of testing.
 - 3. Applicants who opt to take the TEAS at another institution must submit final TEAS scores by the October 15 deadline in order for them to be considered.
 - 4. Applicants <u>must achieve a 63.3%</u> on the overall adjusted score.

STEP III Program-Specific Requirements

- A. Applicants must be eligible to enroll in ENG 111 and MAT 143 without a co-requisite prior to starting NUR 214 in the Spring. In order to be eligible, all pre-requisites courses must be completed, substituted or waived. The pre-requisites for each course can be found in the Course Descriptions section of the catalog. If you have questions regarding eligibility please contact Student Development at 252-246-1281.
- B. Applicants must be enrolled in or have completed BIO 168 by application deadline.
- C. Applicants must have a grade point average of 2.0 or higher on all general education (non-NUR prefix) courses that are required for the Transition Program.
- D. Applicants must have and maintain an unencumbered LPN License, with no history of disciplinary sanctions or actions, with the North Carolina Board of Nursing.

STEP IV Conditional Acceptance and Ranking:

- A. Should there be more qualified applicants than space available, a point system will be used to rank applicants and determine selection for admission to the Transition program. The following items will be used in consideration for ranking:
 - TEAS Adjusted Individual Score.
 - Non-nursing (NUR) courses. If an applicant has taken courses more than once, the highest grade will be used to award points.
 - Diplomas excluding LPN (5 points), Associate Degrees (10 points), and Bachelor's Degree or higher (15 points).
 - 3 points will be awarded to students that graduated from Wilson Community College's practical nursing program.

All documentation for ranking is due by October 15. Documentation received after this date will not be considered.



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- B. Qualified applicants will receive a letter of conditional acceptance by November 15th. Enclosed with this letter will be a Certificate of Acceptance (COA), a physical form and a form with instructions on how to complete criminal background, drug screen, and immunization tracking.
- C. COAs are due to Student Development (F-100) by December 1.
- D. Physical forms are to be submitted through Viewpoint Screening by December 1. Physical exams must be completed by a physician, nurse practitioner, or physician's assistant within 12 months prior to the first day of class.
- E. Immunizations required:
 - a. Current American Heart Healthcare provider CPR certification.
 - b. Tetanus Tdap within the last 10 years,
 - c. Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) 2 shots or a positive titer with results and date,
 - d. Hepatitis B (Hep B) 3 shots or a positive titer with results and date,
 - e. Varicella times two or a positive titer,
 - f. Annual flu vaccine by October 31st; and
 - g. 2 Step TB Skin test or proof of annual for three years. If last annual TB skin test is more than a year old a two-step will be required. Two steps must be done less than 30 days apart. A Quantiferron Gold test may be performed as a supplement to the TB skin test. Students that have tested positive for TB in the past must have a current negative chest XRAY that has been completed within the last year or a negative Quanitiferron Gold.
 - h. COVID 19 Vaccine 2 part Pfizer, 2 part Moderna or 1 part Jansen

Immunizations may not be declined except by a written statement from the applicant's health care provider for acceptable exemptions which may include pregnancy or an allergy to the vaccine.

STEP V Final Acceptance Requirements:

Final acceptance will be determined by the Dean of Allied Health & Sciences based on the following conditions being met:

- A. Student must order and complete the Criminal Background Check, Urine Drug Screen and immunization tracking as required by all clinical agencies by December 1st for final admission. Criminal background and drug screens will be reviewed by the clinical agencies and must be deemed clear by the clinical agency.
- B. Student must be in good academic standing (not on academic warning or probation) for consideration for final admission.
- C. Students must attend a nursing student orientation session before starting the program and uniforms must be ordered at that time. If a student is not able to attend nursing student orientation they will need to schedule an individual appointment with the Dean of Allied Health to review orientation materials.
- D. Students must earn a "B" in all NUR and a "C" in BIO courses.
- E. Students must have successfully completed the following courses by the end of the Fall semester:

F. Students in the ADN evening option have class 2 nights a week on Tuesday and Thursday and clinical every other Saturday and Sunday. This admission is every other year on the even year.

*Note: Evening Option requires all courses to be completed by the end of the Fall semester: ACA 122, PSY 150, PSY 241, BIO 168, BIO 169, ENG 111, MAT 143, HUM 115, and ENG 112. Evening Option is only available in the even years (Spring 2024 next cohort). Students enrolling in the transition program that did not have NUR 117 Pharmacology will be required to take it in the Spring semester.
